LONG TERM RECOVERY VOLUNTEERS AND DONATIONS NEEDED

In the continuing effort to support families that were directly affected by the March 6th Tornado, the Long Term Recovery committee is opening a new location at 709 Broadway Suite D. This location will work in conjunction with Community Services League to aid families. The CSL office will continue to provide food, water, cleaning supplies, paper items, and personal items; and the new location will store new clothing items and act as a furniture exchange for those needing to replace furniture. This site – called the Tornado Recovery Center – will be open the same hours as CSL Oak Grove. Those hours are Tuesday and Thursday, 9 to Noon and 1 to 4.

We are planning to be open on May 9th.
